

PUBLIC LAND MANAGEMENT

9% of REAP is dedicated to the Department of Natural Resources for the development and management of state conservation land, habitat and facilities.

Project examples are trail renovation, shower and restroom replacement, repairs to lodges, shelters and cabins, and minor repairs of dams, spillways, and beaches.


Rathbun Fish Hatchery Appanoose County


- \$21,968 in FY12

- \$107,079 in FY11
- Developed 29 equestrian campsites
- Popular area for equestrians because of 25 miles of trail on challenging terrain.
