On May 20, 2014, the Iowa Environmental Protection Commission set the Title V air operating permit fee for calendar year 2013 emissions at **\$56.00 per ton**. As required by 567 Iowa Administrative Code (IAC) 22.106, the fee payment, along with two copies of Forms 1.0, 5.0, and signed Part 3, must be submitted to the Department of Natural Resources - Air Quality Bureau **no later than July 1, 2014**.

Title V Operating Permit Fee Frequently Asked Questions (FAQ)

When are Title V permit fees due?

They must be post-marked by July 1, 2014.

What forms are required?

Three (3) different forms are required:

1. Form 1.0 - Facility Identification (check the "Annual Emissions / Fee" box at the top)
2. Form 5.0 – Title V Annual Emissions Summary/Fee (check the "Annual Fee payment" box)
3. Part 3 - Application Certification (sign under both "Certification of Fees" and "Certification of Truth, Accuracy and Completeness")

How many copies of the forms are required?

Two (2) copies are required.

If paying by check, to whom should it be made out?

Where do I send the fee payment forms and fee?

Where can I get the fee payment forms?

You can download the forms from the DNR web site at <http://www.iowadnr.gov/InsideDNR/RegulatoryAir/OperatingPermits/InventoryFeePayment.aspx>. To request a hard copy, call (515) 725-9580.

Have any of the fee payment forms changed since last year?

Yes. Part 3 – Application Certification was revised and please use a new Part 3 form for the fee payment.

Where are the instructions for completing the fee payment forms?

The instructions for completing each form are located on the same Operating Permit section's web page as above. They are the same instructions used for completing the Title V operating permit application. To request a hard copy, call (515) 725-9580.

What should I do if I find an error in the emissions inventory I submitted earlier this year?

Include the corrected forms with your fee payment, along with a cover letter describing the corrections.

If I used SPARS Web to submit my emissions inventory earlier this year, how do I prepare and submit the fee payment forms?

Log into SPARS Web and print Form 1.0 and Form 5.0 using SPARS print-preview feature. Make sure the forms are for year 2013. Do not print Part 3 from SPARS Web because it will not allow you to choose all the correct options for fee payment. Please download a Part 3 form from our website, complete it manually, and let the responsible official sign it. Are there any pollutants that do not require fees?

Yes. You do not pay fees for carbon monoxide (CO), PM_{2.5}, total particulate matter (PM), and ammonia (NH₃) emissions. See the definition of "regulated air pollutant (for fee calculation)" in air quality rule 22.100 for more information.

Note: Fees are required for PM₁₀ emissions. Please also note that no fees are required for greenhouse gas (GHG) emissions and do not include GHG emissions on Form 5.0.

Is there a cap on the amount of emissions that require fee payment?

Yes. There is a 4,000 ton cap per pollutant.

Do I need to pay fees on emissions from insignificant activities?

No. According to subrule 22.106(7), fees are not required for emissions from insignificant activities.

Can I just include a total of all the HAPs emitted on Form 5.0?

No. HAP emissions need to be listed separately on Form 5.0, page 2, along with the appropriate Chemical Abstract Service (CAS) number.

How do I avoid double-counting HAP emissions for fee purpose?

Most of the HAPs are also considered VOCs or particulate matter. You are required to report the total for each HAP emitted on Form 5.0, page 2. However, you are not required to pay fees twice for the same emissions. For a listing of these HAPs, please visit the technical guidance portion of the Operating Permits web page.

If a HAP is also a VOC or PM₁₀, **DO NOT** include its emission value in the Emissions Subject to Fees column. Enter "0.00" instead.

If you submit your inventory in SPARS Web, you need to add up all VOC HAP (and/or PM HAP), choose VOC HAP Total (and/or PM HAP Total) from the pollutant list, and enter the total as a negative number.
