

2016 Project AWARE Shuttle Schedule

The use of Project AWARE shuttle services is not required. Due to the high volume of volunteers, support vehicles, and equipment necessary for the event, parking availability at sites along the AWARE route is exceedingly limited. Therefore, the use of personal vehicles on AWARE is strongly discouraged. If personal vehicles are necessary, carpooling amongst volunteers is strongly recommended wherever possible. If the following shuttle schedules do not accommodate your needs, you must make your own arrangements.

If you choose to leave your vehicle somewhere, you choose to do so at your own risk.

DAILY SHUTTLE SERVICE – \$20 per person per day – Shuttles depart daily at 5:00 pm

Due to the exceedingly limited parking availability at sites along the AWARE route, the use and daily shuttling of personal vehicles on AWARE is strongly discouraged. Daily shuttles, however, will be available at a cost of \$20 per person per day. This shuttle service will take participants back to the previous night's camping location only, so if you plan to participate on AWARE for multiple days, you must use and pay for the shuttle each day. Pre-registration for daily shuttles is not available – to use a shuttle you must sign up and pay onsite. **PLEASE NOTE:**

- A ride board is available on the AWARE website, and a ride board will also be available onsite to help volunteers work with one another to make their own shuttle arrangements.
- Daily shuttles will not be necessary on Monday July 11 and Wednesday July 13. If you plan to volunteer either of these days, simply join the AWARE group by 11 am on Monday July 11 at the Wapello County Fairgrounds in Eldon and by 7:00 am at Lacey-Keosauqua State Park on Wednesday July 13.


PRE/POST EVENT SHUTTLE SERVICE – Free

Three shuttle locations will be available for Project AWARE volunteers on Monday, July 11.

- **Des Moines Area Shuttle - Shuttle leaves at 8:00 am**
 - Meet Monday, July 11 at 7:00 am at Des Moines Area Community College Lot L Section 4 (map on page 2).
 - Shuttle will return to Des Moines Friday afternoon, July 15.
- **Iowa City Area Shuttle - Shuttle leaves at 8:30 am**
 - Meet Monday, July 11, at 7:30 am at University of Iowa Research Park; formerly known as Oakdale Campus (map on page 3).
 - Shuttle will return to Iowa City Friday afternoon, July 15.
- **River Valley Horsecamp and Lodge (Farmington, IA) - Shuttle leaves at 9:00 am**
 - Meet Monday, July 11, at 8:00 am at the gravel parking lot at River Valley Horsecamp and Lodge (29932 Hawk Dr.; map on page 4).

Des Moines Area Shuttle Location Map


DMACC Ankeny Campus Lot L

Iowa City Shuttle Location Map


University of Iowa Research Park – Oakdale Hall (OH) Parking Lot
