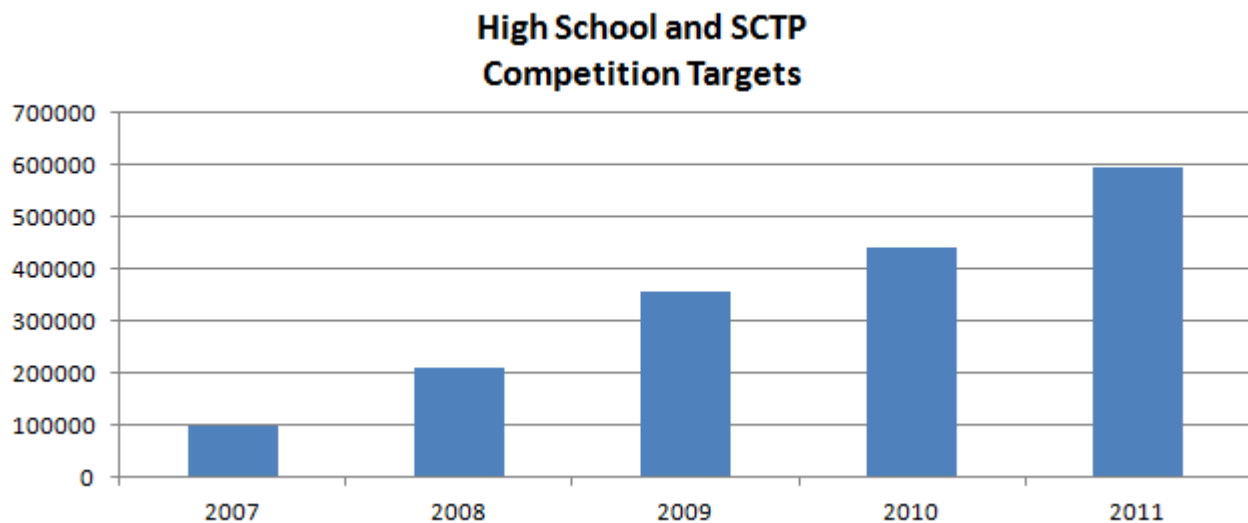

Midway USA Foundation Scholastic Shooting Trust funds for 2012 Iowa State Championship Events

Iowa High School and Scholastic Clay Target Program Teams are eligible for SST funding as outlined below. Any and all funding will go direct to a school's SST account and withdrawal of funding is through the SST granting process only. Registration of teams, athletes and coaches through the Iowa DNR office is required for funding through the High School State Trap Championships and registration through the SCTP national office is required for any of the SCTP State Events.

1. Any team bringing at least one full squad to any one of the four main 2012 Championship events will have \$2,000 deposited to the school's SST account.
2. Schools placing in the top five at the 2012 state High School Trap Championship on June 2nd will have funding placed in their SST account as follows:
 - a. 1st Place Team - \$5,000
 - b. 2nd Place Team - \$3,000
 - c. 3rd through 5th Place Team - \$2,000 each
4. Teams participating with at least one full squad in all three 2012 SCTP state championship events will be eligible for high all around SST funding as follows:
 - a. 1st Place Team - \$5,000
 - b. 2nd Place Team - \$3,000
 - c. 3rd through 5th Place Team - \$2,000 each

*Additional funding though SCTP National may be announced at a later date



About the Scholastic Shooting Trust Fund

The Scholastic Shooting Trust (SST) Fund is owned and controlled by the MidwayUSA Foundation, Inc., a 501(c)(3) not-for-profit, charitable organization established by Larry and Brenda Potterfield in 2007. The Potterfields began the Foundation as a result of their passion and interest in education for shooting, hunting, firearms safety and outdoor skills.

The SST Fund is an endowment to provide financial support for collegiate and high school shooting programs. The SST Fund, through its web site, gives alumni and other interested parties of universities, colleges and high schools the ability to financially support a school's competitive shooting program or financially assist in the start-up of a scholastic shooting program. Donations provide immediate grant potential for a school's shooting program (s) along with sustained funding from the investment earnings of the fund.

Each year the SST Fund will grant money to scholastic shooting programs based on the donations received in the current year and the earnings from the endowed principal of past donations. In general, 5% of the donations received will be used to fund grants for shooting programs. The idea is to provide permanent financial support for scholastic shooting programs. The SST will notify schools of a potential grant during the first week of June. School shooting programs may apply for grants by completing a grant application form and submitting it to the Foundation by June 15 or December 15 of each year. The grant application form will be available under "Forms" on the SST website. School shooting programs may use grant proceeds to fund travel, uniforms, ammunition, entry fees, scholarships, range rental, etc.; however, grant funds may not be used to purchase guns. The applications are reviewed and decided upon by the Foundation and its Board of Directors. Grants will be paid to the shooting programs on or about August 15 (June grants) or February 15 (December grants). 2012 SCTP Skeet Program Main Event

The 2012 Scholastic Clay Target Program State Skeet Championships will consist of 100 targets registered with the National Skeet Shooting Association. Registration starts at 7:00AM with first squads out at 8:00AM. There will be a mandatory coaches meeting at 7:30, at least one coach per team must be in attendance.

Entry Fees and Practice

The SCTP State Skeet Championship event is \$26 which includes the \$4 NSSA and \$1 ISSA fees. Practice skeet will be limited. Entry fee payment will be made to 'Iowa SCTP, Inc.' and will be collected the day of the competition.

Divisions

Divisions will follow the same criteria as defined by the Scholastic Clay Target Program: Rookie (5th grade and under), Intermediate (6-8 grades) and Senior (9-12 grades).

Competitive Squads

Competitive squads shall consist of 3 shooters from the same SCTP team. Teams not able to field even squads shall allow individuals to compete for individual awards only. Mixing shooters from different divisions (bump-ups) is allowed to round out a competitive squad (see SCTP rulebook for bump-up). ***Squads of mixed divisions/categories will shoot as individuals, please check your team rosters provided by the DNR for SCTP division classification.***

Categories

Categories will be used in the Intermediate (entry level or experienced), Senior (Jr. Varsity or Varsity) and collegiate divisions.

Eligibility

All participants must be part of a SCTP team and be registered with the Iowa DNR and SCTP. Teams must have conducted at least 6 practices (shoots do not count as practices) prior to the event. Participants in this event must be current members of the National Skeet Shooting Association or become members at the shoot. All competitors must be students in good standing and must be academically eligible to participate in extra-curricular activities as defined by their school. All competitors must be members of the NSSA. NSSA/NSCA membership application forms for new members can be found at: <http://www.iowadnr.gov/Recreation/ShootingSports/ClayTargetProgramSCTP/CoachProgramResources.aspx>. New member paper applications should be turned in at shoot registration and will be processed after the event. For fastest service, athletes may also apply online at www.nssa-nsca.org. Please allow 2 weeks for new member online processing, otherwise plan to become a NSSA/NSCA member at the event. ***If current members, all athletes must present their NSSA/NSCA card which contains their NSSA and/or NSCA number. This is a different card than the DNR issued ID card.***

High School Awards

Separate 1st, 2nd and 3rd place team awards will be given for high school squads where all squad members are from the same school and in grades 9-12. High school teams will shoot as competitive squads as defined by SCTP rules. ***High school competitive squads must have submitted a letter from the school's principal or AD stating the shooting program is school affiliated.***

High school all state team awards will be given to the top 3 boys and top 3 girls based on the cumulative total of the 50 invitational league targets and the 100 SCTP targets. All shoot offs and awards will be conducted at the conclusion of Sunday's competition.

2012 SCTP Sporting Clays Program Main Event

The 2012 Scholastic Clay Target Program State Sporting Clays Championships will consist of 100 targets registered with the National Sporting Clays Association. Registration starts at 7:00AM with first squads out at 8:00AM. There will be a mandatory coaches meeting at 7:30, at least one coach per team must be in attendance.

Entry Fees and Practice

The SCTP State Sporting Clays Championships entry fees are \$36 which includes the \$4 NSCA fees. Entry fee payment will be made to 'Iowa SCTP, Inc.' and will be collected the day of the competition.

Divisions

Divisions will follow the same criteria as defined by the Scholastic Clay Target Program: Rookie (5th grade and under), Intermediate (6-8 grades) and Senior (9-12 grades).

Competitive Squads

Competitive squads shall consist of 3 shooters from the same SCTP team. Teams not able to field even squads shall allow individuals to compete for individual awards only. 2012 High School State Trap Championships

June 2 at the ISTA Homegrounds

2012 Iowa High School State Trap Championships

The 2012 Iowa High School State Trap Championships will consist of 100 targets. The first 50 targets will be shot at 16 yards and the second 50 targets will be shot at 19 yards. All 100 targets will be shot at the same trap consecutively. Registration starts at 7:00AM, safety meeting at 7:30 with first flight out at 8:00AM. At least one coach per team must be in attendance at the safety meeting.

Entry Fees and Practice

Entry fees for the High School state trap championships will be \$18 plus tax (\$19.26). Schools claiming exemption must bring a tax-exempt certificate at registration. Payment will be made to the 'Iowa State Trapshooting Association' and will be collected the day of the competition.

Practice will be available for \$6 per round (tax included). Practice traps will be open on Thursday from 3:00 to 7:00 and ***may*** be open 8:00AM each day on Friday and Saturday, depending on field availability.

Shoot Registration

All participating teams must have registered their team, coach and athlete information on with the Iowa DNR prior to registering for this event. All registration and squadding for the High School state championship event must be submitted by coaches via email to the shoot director. DNR pre-registration form is available at: <http://www.iowadnr.gov/Recreation/ShootingSports/ClayTargetProgramSCTP/SCTPEventsResults.aspx> and must be submitted by email by 5:00PM, May 23rd. On-site registrations will not be accepted.

Shooting times will be confirmed to coaches by May 25th.

Divisions

This event has only one 'high-school' division and is open only to students in grades 9-12.

Competitive Squads

Competitive squads shall consist of 5 shooters from the same high school. Teams not able to field even squads shall allow individuals to compete for individual awards only. Mixing shooters from different schools is not allowed unless the schools already share two or more sports.

Eligibility

All participants must be part of a Iowa High School/SCTP team and have all team, coach and participant paperwork turned into the Iowa DNR by **May 1st, or prior to their first league event** (whichever date occurs first). All competitors must be students in good standing and must be academically eligible to participate in extra-curricular activities as defined by their school.

All participants must have shot at least 4 league events (200 targets) leading up to the High School state shoot and have results of those events on file with the Iowa DNR. A complete listing of invitational events can be found on the DNR website:

Shooting Sequence

Flight times will no longer be published, it is ***your team's*** responsibility to monitor the progress of your assigned trap. Your entire squad must be ready to shoot by the time the previous squad starts their final round. Failure to be present at your assigned trap on time may result in disqualification.

Awards

Team awards will be given to the top six teams. Individual awards will be given to the top 6 boy and the top 6 girl overall shooters.

High school all state team awards will be given to the top 6 teams and 6 individuals for both male and female based on the cumulative total of the 200 league targets and the 100 high school championship targets. All state team awards will be given at the conclusion of the Iowa High School State Trap shoot on June 2.

For the sixth year running, the Iowa DNR will sponsor the 'Iowa Cup' trophy. This award will be given to the high scoring high school team based on the cumulative total of the 200 league targets plus the 100 high school championship targets plus the 200 SCTP state championship targets (2,500 season targets based on top 5 shooters from a given high school). Additional award information can be found on page 4 of this program.

Volunteer Safety Officers, Scorekeepers and Trap Loading

Each team will need to provide two volunteer safety officials for each of their squads. Each team must provide 1 scorekeeper per squad on the next squad out on that same field. A limited number of DNR staff will be available for short squad assistance. Teams assigned to the last flight of the day must provide a scorekeeper for the first flight of the day. Coaches/volunteer officials will be responsible for loading houses ***upon completion of their squads***. If you have an emergency situation and cannot provide a score-keeper, please notify shoot officials at registration so a substitute can be located and provided.

ISTA Campground Reservations

Friday, June 1st at the ISTA Homegrounds

2012 SCTP Trap Program Main Event

The 2012 Scholastic Clay Target Program state Trap Championships will consist of 200, 16 yard targets. Rookie division shooters will shoot 100 targets only (50 at a time). Participants shooting 200 targets will get approximately 2 hours rest time between each 100 targets. All SCTP state trap targets will be non-registered (ATA registration is not an option this year). Registration starts at 7:00AM, safety meeting at 7:30 with first flight out at 8:00AM. At least one coach per team must be in attendance at the safety meeting.

Entry Fees and Practice

Entry fees for the SCTP state trap championships will be \$36 plus tax (\$38.52) Rookie division shooters will pay \$18 plus tax (\$19.26). Payment will be made to the 'Iowa State Trapshooting Association' and will be collected the day of the competition. Schools claiming exemption must bring a tax-exempt certificate at registration.

Practice will be available for \$6 per round (tax included). Practice traps will be open on Thursday from 3:00 to 7:00 and **may** be open 8:00AM each day on Friday and Saturday, depending on field availability.

Divisions

Divisions will follow the same criteria as defined by the Scholastic Clay Target Program: Rookie (5th grade and under), Intermediate (6-8 grades) and Senior (9-12 grades).

All registration and squadding for the SCTP state championship events must be submitted by coaches via email to the shoot director. DNR pre-registration form is available at: <http://www.iowadnr.gov/Recreation/ShootingSports/ClayTargetProgramSCTP/SCTPEventsResults.aspx> and must be submitted by email by 5:00PM, May 23rd. ***Squads must also be assembled on the SCTP website on or before May 11th.*** On-site registrations for the SCTP state championship events will not be accepted.

Shooting times will be confirmed to coaches by May 25th.

Shooting Sequence

Flight times will no longer be published, it is ***your team's*** responsibility to monitor the progress of your assigned trap. Your entire squad must be ready to shoot by the time the previous squad starts their final round. Failure to be present at your assigned trap on time may result in disqualification.

SCTP Awards

SCTP team awards will be given for three places in each division and category. Individual awards will be given to the top 3 boy and the top 3 girl shooters in each division and category.

For the sixth year running, the Iowa DNR will sponsor the 'Iowa Cup' trophy. This award will be given to the high scoring high school team based on the cumulative total of the 200 invitational league targets plus the 100 high school championship targets plus the 200 SCTP state championship targets (2,500 season targets based on top 5 shooters from a given high school). Additional award information can be found on page 4 of this program.

Volunteer Safety Officers, Scorekeepers and Trap Loading

Each team will need to provide two volunteer safety officials for each of their squads. Each team must provide 1 scorekeeper per squad on the next squad out on that same field. A limited number of DNR staff will be available for short squad assistance. Teams assigned to the last flight of the day must provide a scorekeeper for the first flight of the day. Coaches/volunteer officials will be responsible for loading houses ***upon completion of their squads.*** If you have an emergency situation and cannot provide a score-keeper, please notify shoot officials at registration so a substitute can be located and provided.

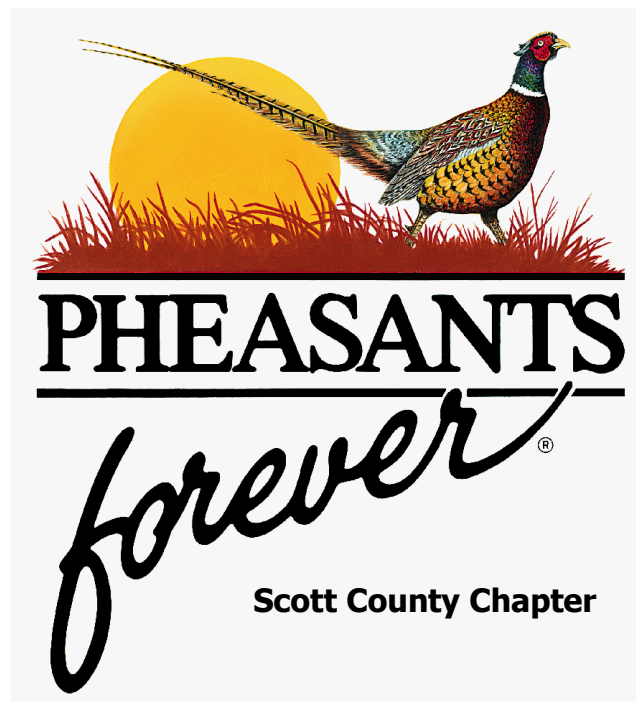
2012 Fall All-Coaches Meeting

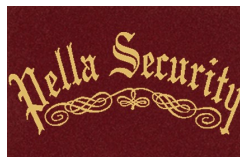
