Or perhaps first ask yourself, “is this hazardous waste?” But how can you determine it quickly, easily and accurately? If your answer is “I don’t know”, then we encourage you to join us for this informative workshop. Representatives of the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency will discuss the specifics of hazardous waste identification and management, and provide plenty of opportunities for questions and open-ended discussion.

Perhaps you are already managing your waste and looking for more ways to cut your disposal costs. Your waste may be a desirable product for someone else. But, can you make that determination? And even if your waste can be reused or recycled...how can you find someone to take it off your hands? This workshop will bring together representatives from a variety of state and local programs that are able to assist you in your efforts. A representative from the Iowa Waste Exchange will share information on the IWE program and answer your questions about how the program can help your business save both money and resources. The Iowa Waste Reduction Center and the Pollution Prevention Services program will also discuss how they can assist you in reducing wastes at the source with pollution prevention strategies, and provide information on financial assistance resources that can support business investment in waste reduction strategies. This includes on-site review services of the IWRC and an example or two of regulations/violations that industry should be particularly aware of. The Waste Commission of Scott County, the solid waste agency serving the Scott County area, offers many services to assist you in managing your waste streams. They will discuss the specific services offered to businesses in their area and can address questions about various service offerings from solid waste agencies statewide.
