**Location- Springbrook Conservation Education Center**

The Springbrook Conservation Education Center is located about 55 miles northwest of Des Moines at the Springbrook State Recreation Area. The diverse habitats of the area make it an ideal setting for the experience.

**Lodging** is in dormitories with 7 participants and one adult per room. Linens (pillow, blanket, sheets, and towels) are provided. Shower facilities and restrooms are in the dorms. All buildings are smoke free and air conditioned. All food is included and prepared on-site by our concessionaire. You will not be hungry!
