PLEASE MARK ALL YOUR GEAR

Volunteer gear inevitably ends up in the AWARE Lost & Found. It is strongly recommended that you label all of your gear - if your name is on it we can return it to you. Colored duct tape and/or sharpie markers are all you need to make sure your gear finds its way home.

- Comfy camp shoes, mocs, or sandals
- Extra Socks & Underwear
- Extra set(s) of warm, dry clothes
- Bandanas
- Rain pants**
- Rain jacket**

- Sunglasses
- Safety Strap for Glasses

Camping Gear
