

MANAGEMENT GRANTS PROGRAM

Request for Proposals

Program Description:

The Iowa Wildlife Diversity Program, funded by donations from the Fish and Wildlife Protection Fund (Chickadee Checkoff) and Natural Resources License Plate funds, has small grants available for management projects directly related to wildlife diversity conservation. Approved projects will be funded on a single-year basis but can be submitted for additional funding in subsequent years (not to exceed 3 years in succession) though it should be noted up front if a project will likely be multi-year. Total grant allotment is \$15,000 per year with \$7,500 being the maximum amount available per proposal request. This funding will begin on July 15, 2010.

Request Procedures

Who Should Apply:

All DNR Partners: County Conservation Boards, Sportsman's Groups, non-profit conservation organizations.

Requests for funding should be concise and contain information according to the following guidelines:

1. Title of the management project.
2. Objectives – describe the immediate goals of the project. These goals should be synonymous with the goals of Iowa's Wildlife Action Plan (IWAP) <http://www.iowadnr.com/wildlife/diversity/plan.html> and should benefit Species of Greatest Conservation Need.
3. Project area – describe the area where the management project will take place including its benefit for wildlife diversity.
4. Procedures – explain in detail how the management practices will accomplish project objectives.
5. Personnel – identify the personnel that will be primarily responsible for planning and conducting the management project. Others who will be involved with the project should also be identified (including a description of the tasks they will perform).
6. Budget – include an itemized budget and a complete breakdown of costs for the entire project. If the amount requested from this proposal is less than the total project cost, the specific request should be noted. Matching funds or other sources of funding for this project should also be listed.
7. Calendar – give expected initiation time, estimated dates for each task, and date of completion. Note whether the project will likely be resubmitted for future years funding.

Project Eligibility

1) Projects to be considered will have management for wildlife diversity as their primary focus, some examples of which are:

- a. Reconstruction and restoration of wildlife habitat.
- b. Pre- and post-monitoring for a species or group of species targeted by management practices.
- c. Purchase of important equipment whose primary use would be dedicated to management for wildlife diversity.
- d. Developing a community prescribed burning cooperative to help put proper management on private lands.

2) The money provided can not be used for reimbursement on projects already completed before the grant money is available on July 15, 2010.

3) If the project will cost a great deal more than what is requested in the grant application, the source of additional funding must be listed and secured. Projects with other funding sources pending will not score as highly and would not be notified whether it had been accepted prior to the additional funding being secured.

Review Procedures

All proposals received will be reviewed by an IDNR technical review committee and will be scored based upon:

1. Relationship to the goals of the Wildlife Action Plan. In particular, the project should be shown to benefit Iowa's Species of Greatest Conservation Need.
2. Budget considerations.
3. Adherence to request procedures.

DUE DATE: Proposals must be received **before 5pm on December 15, 2009.**

NOTIFICATION: Notice of proposals acceptance or decline will be sent to all applicants by March 31, 2010.

FUNDING DISBURSEMENT: Funding will begin on July 15, 2010
