## Federal Appropriations Reductions FY 2018 & FY 2019

President Trump's budget proposal for federal fiscal year 2018 includes recommendations for two changes to Clean Air Act Grants to States and Local governments. First, the budget proposes to reduced federal Clean Air Act (CAA) section 105 grants by 30%. Second, the President proposes to reduce CAA section 103 grants by 30%, and reduce the remainder by 40%, requiring states to provide a 40% match the 60% federal fund contribution.

The federal fiscal year begins October 1, 2017 (one quarter into the state fiscal year (FY)). The CAA § (section) 105 grants coincide with the federal fiscal year (FFY).

The CAA § 103 grant year begins on April 1, 2018 (three quarters into the state fiscal year).

\* One third of CAA § 103 funding to the state is taken "off the top" for federal laboratory analysis of PM2.5 filters for the state.

### Reductions in Funding available (compared to FY 2017)

Potential increase in match	-\$49,620	-\$198,480
Total	-\$311,580	-\$582,760
