#### Fish Iowa Unit

# Day 1

## **Teaching Objective**

At the end of class, all students will be able to identify the characteristics of a fish and identify a fish by looking at sample pictures. Students will also know how to tie a hook on the line correctly using different knots.

#### Reference Unit/Materials

Fish Iowa! Unit #3 (pg. 42-43) Fish Iowa! Unit #2 (pg. 25-33)

#### **Materials needed**

String that is precut to 36" Volleyball standards with eye hooks *Fish Iowa!* cards for identifying fish

# **Description of Activities**

Explain what Fish Iowa! is and what we hope to accomplish by the end of the unit.

- 1. Use pages 25-33 to talk about the different types of fish families and how to identify them.
- 2. Use the Fish Iowa! cards to play go fish and do peer assessment.
- 3. Demonstrate the improved clinch knot and palomar knot for the students.
- 4. Have the students partner up and practice tying these knots with the string and eye hooks.
- 5. If time is allowed we will demonstrate casting.

# Day 2

# **Teaching Objective**

At the end of class, all students will know about fishing ethics and regulations. Students will also know the parts of a fishing rod and how to care for and maintain it. Students will practice proper casting techniques.

#### **Materials Needed**

2 piece rod and reels Quick fishing facts sheet for everyone

# **Description of Activities**

- 1. Hand out the quick fishing facts yellow sheet to everyone and talk about many aspects.
- 2. Discuss who needs a license, where to get a license, where they can go fishing, catching fish, hooking fish, keeping fish, and transporting fish.
- 3. Talk about the rod, reel, line, and parts that make up a fishing pole using the pole as an example and pages 41-42 of the *Fish Iowa!* book.

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- 4. Demonstrate how to care for and maintain the pole while the students are practicing on their pole.
- 5. Discuss and model casting procedures and the do's and don'ts using pg. 44-45 and 48 of the *Fish Iowa*! book. The students will stand in a line and practice casting with no targets.
- 6. At the end of class students will take Review Sheet 2-2 which covers the differences in fish.

# Day 3

# **Teaching Objective**

At the end of class, all students will have practiced target casting. The students will also understand the different types of lures and be able to bait a hook. Students will also understand the catch and release method so that the fish is not injured or killed when removing a hook. Students will also understand keeping the catch even though we will only be practicing catch and release.

Fake Fish
Lids/Targets
Gummy worms
Lure examples

#### **Description of Activities**

- 1. All students will get into groups and practice casting at targets.
- 2. Students will get pre-made score sheets and track their progress.
- 3. Show examples of the different types of lures and talk about the different fish they would catch.
- 4. Have the students practice baiting their hooks with gummy worms.
- 5. Discuss the catch and release method and how to take fish off the hook so they are not injured.
- 6. We will talk about keeping the catch even though they will be practicing catch and release in class.
