



Reporting Bald Eagles: Nesting in Iowa





In 1996 lowa possessed only 54 active nests in 20 counties. However, over the last decade those numbers have increased substantially, as new nests are being reported every year. In 2008, 83 out of the 99 lowa counties possess bald eagle nests. Conservative estimates indicate lowa possesses 200 active bald eagle nests.

Only conservative estimates are available, because the Iowa DNR staff no longer has the resources to monitor many of the Iowa nests, nor to adequately search for new nests. Monitoring of nests is left mostly up to volunteers and concerned citizens. Therefore, the discovery of new nests, which is often by chance, is primarily by volunteers, other citizens, and agency staff. As a result many nests go unnoticed and unreported.

If you or anyone you know locates a bald eagle nest, please report your findings to the lowa Department of Natural Resources Wildlife Diversity Program, 1436 255th Street, Boone, IA 50036.

Observing Eagle Nests:

- Realize that nesting eagles are protected by law, please do not disturb them. A distance of 1/4 mile is recommended particularly during the months of Jan-March.
- Recommended timing for observations:
 - 1) March for Adult activity
 - 2) Late April to try to count young (in nest unable to fly)
- 3) Mid-June Mid-July to count fledged young (bird almost as large as adult, standing on edge or near nest or seen flying near nest.)
- Realize that nests are typically on private land, so please do not trespass unless permission from the landowner has been granted

Nest Location Information:

- Nest location is necessary to identify the nest or to consider it a new discovery -Please be as specific as possible!
- County is required
- Township or Tier and Range and Section and quarter section based off the Public Land Survey System (or PLSS) or UTMs are required

Physical descriptions (roads, mile marker, river mile, bridges, islands, landmarks, etc.) can be useful in helping us locate the nest

Nest Site Landowner Information:

If you know the landowner where the nest is located, please provide their contact information

Nest Information:

- History of the nest, if known, can be useful in identifying the nest, such as year established or other nearby nests
- Tree species if known
- Is the tree living or dead Circle one.

- Estimate the nest's height from the ground in feet
- Water body utilized is the body of water that the nest is closest to, or which the eagles most likely utilize for fishing
