The orientation is "open book" and 95% correct answers are required for successful completion.

1. Three main rules of firearms safety are (check three answers) 3 points:

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- a. Always keep the safety on
- b. Always keep your gun pointed in a safe direction
- c. Load only one shell at a time
- d. Always keep your finger off the trigger until ready to shoot
- e. Always keep your firearm unloaded until ready to use
- 2. Who can announce a "Cease Fire" if a safety violation is about to happen or is in progress? 1 point
 - a. Anyone
 - b. Range Safety Officer
- 3. On the rifle/handgun range, the red lights "ON" mean the range is in what condition? 1 point
 - a. The range is HOT firing/handling firearms is permitted
 - b. The range is COLD- firing/handling firearms is NOT permitted
- 4. Who is permitted to operate the rifle/handgun range lights? 1 point

 - b. Remove all ammunition from the firearm
 - c. Unload magazines or remove (removable type) magazines
 - d. Lock or place the action in the OPEN position
 - e. Place your firearm on the bench
 - f. Stand away from the shooting bench
 - g. If shooting a muzzleloader, remove the priming/capping device and place the hammer in the "down" position
 - h. Clean your firearm
- 9. Which youth shooters are NOT permitted on the range (check all not permitted): 1 point

 - c. 16 year old shooting rifle or shotgun without direct supervision (within arm's reach) but with express consent of his/her father

- 12. When leaving the shooting stand on the shotgun range, shooters must ensure their shotgun is completely unloaded (chamber and magazine) and actions are locked open: 1 point
