General Information

- All participants must be registered with the Scholastic Clay Target Program and have all team, coach and participant paperwork on file with the SCTP before registering for any League or Championship Events.
- Shotguns with release triggers or exposed hammers are not allowed at Iowa SCTP League or Championship events.
- As stated in the National SCTP Handbook, ear buds designed to listen to music (either Bluetooth or corded) are not allowed in SCTP practices or competitions.
- Use of tobacco or alcohol is prohibited for all contestants, coaches and spectators during the course of events or awards ceremonies.
- Athlete transfer process: While it is preferred that an athlete competes for their “home” team, the SCTP does allow a one time transfer for an athlete. Any athlete transfer request must come from the current head coach to the DNR Shooting Sports Coordinator, who will then determine the next closest team that will accept that student athlete. Any athlete transferring teams midseason will lose any existing league scores. The athlete’s league scores will be based only on those scores earned with the new team.

League Information

- The governing rules for leagues are those of the SCTP and the applicable National Governing Body.
- All events must be between two or more registered SCTP teams.
- All Iowa SCTP League events must take place in Iowa or within 15 miles of the Iowa border. The only exception is for Regional SCTP events held by the National SCTP staff, where 2 Iowa teams still need to be present.
- For Iowa SCTP League events, for a Senior Division Shoot, there must be Senior Division athletes from at least two teams competing. Due to fewer teams having Rookie and Intermediate athletes, this requirement does not apply to those divisions, only that there are athletes from at least 2 different teams competing. This requirement also does not apply to shoots that are registered with the ATA, NSSA, or NSCA.
- All events must be published on the SCTP SHOT system 2 days prior to the event.
- All scores for teams and individuals must be posted to the SHOT system within 1 day of the conclusion of the event.
- Registered Shoots (ATA, NSSA, NSCA) can count toward league scores and be entered in SHOT under the following conditions:
 - The registered event is entered in SHOT at least 2 days prior to the event.
 - Registration is closed in SHOT at least the night before the event in order for targets to be used for SCTP purposes.
 - An athlete must be registered for the event on SHOT in order for the targets to be used for SCTP.
 - There must be athletes from at least 2 different teams participating at the event.
 - The “host” coach must enter the scores into SHOT and is responsible for obtaining copies of the scoresheets from the host club for the SCTP athletes.
- League specific requirements can be found in this program for each league.

Championship Information

- Athletes must have attended at least six practices (shoots do not count as practices) prior to attending a State Championship Event. All competitors must be students in good standing and must be academically eligible to participate in extra-curricular activities as defined by their school.
- All athletes must have the respective National Governing Body and State Association membership paperwork completed prior to being squadded for a state championship event. Membership applications will not be accepted at the events.
- Entry fees must be paid by check for pre-registration and by card only at the time of registration. Fees must be paid prior to taking the field. No refunds once entry fees have been paid.
- Any team needing an invoice to pay from for Championship events, must request it by the close of the registration period for that event.
- All squads must be at their assigned field/trap and ready to take the field when the previous squad finishes. Squads may be moved to an alternate field at the shoot director's discretion to facilitate timely completion of the event. Late squads will be bumped until the end of the day unless another field opens up and you are moved by management.
- No coaching of athletes while on the field, course, or at a shooting station.
- Shoot management reserves the right to alter/change the shoot program at any time, for any reason.



Junior College Clay Target Championship

October 21-22, 2023 at the New Pioneer Gun Club

Waukee, IA

The 2023 Scholastic Clay Target Program Collegiate Clay Target Championships will include Trap, Skeet, Sporting Clays, and Super Sporting. The Championships will consist of 100 targets each in American Skeet, American Trap, and Sporting Clays, and 50 targets in Super Sporting for a total of 350 targets.

Event Registration

The event is open to Iowa SCTP Collegiate athletes attending 2 year colleges in Iowa. Athletes must be enrolled full-time and in good standing. Teams, Coaches, and Athletes must be registered with the Scholastic Clay Target Program. Coaches must register their teams through the SHOT system. Online registration will open at 8am on October 2, and will close at midnight on October 18.

All athletes must be classified in the SHOT system as collegiate athletes. All athletes must be registered as a full time student at a 2 year college in Iowa. Any other Iowa SCTP registered collegiate athletes may attend as space allows, but will not be eligible for awards.

Rules

Current SCTP, ATA, NSSA, and NSCA rules, and any match director's bulletins posted at the range govern this match. Ties among individuals, squads or teams will result in shoot-offs and will follow the SCTP shoot-off procedures.

The 2024 Iowa Junior Olympic (JO) Skeet Championships will consist of 125 total targets. 75 targets on Saturday, and 50 targets on Sunday. The event will conclude with a fun final with flash targets after the 50 targets on Sunday. This is for fun only and will have no bearing on the 125 target results.

State Skeet Doubles Championships

***May 25, at the Mahaska County Ikes
Oskaloosa, IA***

The 2024 Scholastic Clay Target Program State Skeet Doubles Championships will consist of 50 targets. All targets will be registered with the National Skeet Shooting Association. The 2024 Skeet Doubles Championship will only be open to athletes classified as Intermediate Advanced, Senior Junior Varsity and Senior Varsity.

Event Registration

All participating teams must have registered their team, coach and athlete information on the SHOT system prior to registering for this event. Coaches or their designee are responsible for event registration and squad assembly, which must be done through the SHOT system. Teams will only be allowed to register 2 squads per team (6 athletes) during the online registration period. Once registration closes, an assessment will be made to determine if additional athletes may be registered. Time and field assignments are on a first-come, first-served basis. Online registration will open at 8am on **May 4. On-site registrations for this event will not be accepted. All squads must be assembled online by May 19.**

Entry Fees

All Divisions (50 targets): **\$32**

*Entry fees include target, scoring, and NSSA and ISSA fees. Entry fee payment will be made to **Iowa SCTP, Inc.** by card only the day of the competition. No cash or checks will be accepted on site. No refunds will be given.

Participants in this event **must be current members of the National Skeet Shooting Association.** This must be done prior to the shoot. NSSA/NSSCA joint membership can be completed through the SHOT System, or by completing the NSSA/NSSCA application.

Practice

Practice will not be available on the days of the event.

Competitive Squads

Competitive squads will consist of three athletes in the same division and category from the same SCTP team. Athletes from teams who cannot field full squads will compete for individual and team awards, but not squad awards.

Rules

The rules defined by the Scholastic Clay Target Program and the National Skeet Shooting Association shall govern this event. Ties for top places listed below among individuals, squads or teams will result in shoot offs and will follow the SCTP shoot-off procedures.

Eligibility

All participants must be part of a SCTP team and be registered with the SCTP. Teams must have conducted at least six practices (on any discipline) prior to the event. All competitors must be students in good standing and must be academically eligible to participate in extra-curricular activities as defined by their school.

Skeet Doubles League

The Skeet Doubles League is open to all athletes and teams registered with the SCTP. The course of fire for the league is American Skeet Doubles, and the governing rules are that of the national Scholastic Clay Target Program and the National Skeet Shooting Association. The 2023-24 Competition Season will end **May 19**.

The league will consist of 150 targets (3 scores of 50 targets), with scores from at least two different skeet facilities. The Rounds for Skeet Doubles consist of a Round of 24 and a Round of 26 and they should be recorded in SHOT as a total score out of 50 targets. Athletes or teams may shoot as many targets as they wish, with the highest three scores from at least 2 different facilities being selected to determine each athletes' League Score. All events must be between two or more registered SCTP teams and published on the SCTP SHOT system 2 days prior to the event. All scores for teams and individuals must be posted to the SHOT system within 1 day of the conclusion of the event.

Skeet Doubles League Tie Breaking Process

Intermediate Advanced and Senior Divisions: League ties in the American Skeet Doubles League will be determined by the total from the Championship event (50 targets). If a tie remains after the 50 Championship targets, a reverse run will be used starting with the last round, and to the first round if necessary.

Rookies and Intermediate Entry: Since there is no Skeet Doubles Championship Event for Rookies and Intermediate Entry athletes in 2024, League ties for 1st-3rd places in the Skeet Doubles League will be resolved following the SCTP Skeet shoot-off procedure: doubles from stations 3-4-5 for cumulative score. If contestants are still tied, continuing on with doubles at stations 3-4-5 in sudden death until a winner is determined. Rookie and Intermediate Entry Skeet Doubles League awards will be presented at the American Skeet Championship.

State Trap Championships

June 3-9, at the ISTA Homegrounds Cedar Falls, IA

The 2024 Scholastic Clay Target Program State Trap Championships will consist of three events, a Doubles Trap Championship, a Handicap Championship, and American Singles Trap Championship. The Doubles Championship will consist of 100 targets (50 pairs), Handicap Trap Championship will consist of 100 targets (Rookies from 19 yd., Intermediates from 21 yd., and Seniors from 25 yd.), and the American Singles Trap Championship will consist of 200, 16 yard targets for Seniors and Intermediates, and 100, 16 yard targets for Rookies. The Doubles and 16 yard Singles American Trap State Championship events will both be registered events (ATA and ISTA registration is required).

Event Registration

All participating teams must have registered their team, coach and athlete information on the SHOT system prior to registering for this event. Coaches or their designee are responsible for event registration and squad assembly, which must be done online through the SHOT system. Flight and trap assignments are on a first-come, first-served basis. On-site registrations for this event will not be accepted.

- **April 18:** Pre-registration forms must be postmarked **on or after** this date.
- **May 2:** Last day to **receive** Pre-registration forms
- **May 4:** Online registration opens at **8am** for Rookie and Intermediate Singles, and all Doubles and Handicap squads.
- **May 5:** Online registration opens at **8am** for Senior Division Singles event.
- **May 22:** Online registration closes at midnight.
- **May 22:** All ATA/ISTA dues must be paid.
- **May 28:** Last day to request squad changes.

Practice

Designated practice traps will be open on Monday, June 5 from 3pm-6pm. Starting at 7am on Tuesday and for the remainder of the event, practice will be allowed on up to 10 designated traps from 7 to 7:50 am and then on 2 designated traps for the remainder of the day [barring unforeseen circumstances]. Practice tickets are required and can be purchased in the registration building. Cost for practice is \$8 per round of 25 targets for handicap and American trap, and \$8 for doubles (12 pair).

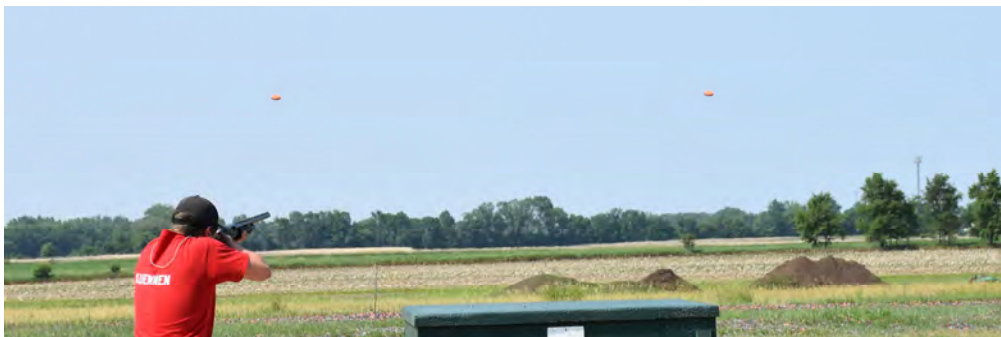

*It is your team's responsibility to monitor the progress of your assigned trap. Your entire squad must be ready to shoot by the time the previous squad starts their final round. Failure to be present at your assigned trap on time may result in disqualification. **Squads will be required to complete their targets in the allotted time. Failure to complete the targets in the allotted time may result in the incomplete round(s) being scored as lost or the squad finishing their targets at the end of the day.** Exceptions may be made for athletes with disabilities. It is the coach's responsibility to notify shoot management to receive an exception prior to a squad with a disabled athlete taking the field.





Divisions

Divisions and categories will follow the criteria defined by the Scholastic Clay Target Program:

- Rookie (5th grade and under)
- Intermediate (6-8 grades)
 - Entry Level (1st year of participation as an Intermediate)
 - Advanced
- Senior (9-12 grades)
 - Junior Varsity (1st year of participation as a Senior)
 - Varsity

Competitive Squads

Competitive squads will consist of five athletes from the same SCTP team. In the Trap Singles event, a complete squad must be composed of 5 athletes in the same category (i.e., Rookie, IE, IA, JV and Varsity). Any partial squad or squad composed of athletes from different divisions or categories will compete for individual and team awards, but not squad awards. For the Trap Doubles and Handicap events, a complete squad must be composed of 5 athletes from the same Division (i.e., Rookie, Intermediate, Senior). Any partial squad or squad composed of athletes from different divisions will compete for individual and team awards, but not squad awards.

Rules

The rules defined by the Scholastic Clay Target Program and the Amateur Trap Association shall govern this event. Ties for 1st-3rd in Doubles and Handicap for individual or squad awards, 1st-6th place in Singles among individuals, or 1st-5th place ties among squads or teams will result in shoot offs and will follow the SCTP shoot-off procedures.

Eligibility

All participants must be registered with an Iowa SCTP team and be registered with the SCTP in the SHOT system. All athletes must have participated in at least 6 on-field practices (shoots do not count as practices) prior to the championship event. All competitors must be students in good standing and must be academically eligible to participate in extra-curricular activities as defined by their school.

2. You must remain inside the boundaries for your campsite. Use the site markers to find your campsite, not landmarks! No campfires, fire pits, wading or swimming pools. NO CARTS OR ATV/UTVS other than those used by staff to facilitate the shoot. Don't even bring onto property.
3. Returning campers from 2023 have until March 15, 2024 to lease the same site(s) for this year. Envelope must be postmarked no later than March 15, 2024. NO SUBLETTING allowed. The ISTA reserves the right to re-assign sites as necessary.
4. Camping reservations must be in writing and accompanied by payment.
5. Cancellations must be made via email at **iowastateshoot@gmail.com**. No refunds will be made if cancellation is made less than 7 days prior to June 2, 2024 unless ISTA is able to fill the vacancy.
6. The ISTA Board of Directors are asking individuals who rent campsites for parking alone to please let the ISTA use them for camping as they are intended to be used. Vehicles that pull the camper should be parked by the camper. If you are putting up a large/commercial tent for your team using stakes, please note that as the ISTA is required to call OneCall.
