The facility also handles appliances, scrap metal, waste oil, tires, household hazardous waste, leadacid batteries and glass. Items removed prior to shredding are tires, appliances, propane tanks, furniture and mattresses. Everything else goes into the primary shredder and is reduced to the size of a football; ferrous metals are removed after the first shred, and then everything is shredded again, reducing the size to about that of a golf ball.
