Dear Administrator Hague:

On behalf of the state of Iowa, I write to request the continued designation of "attainment" for all 99 counties in Iowa for the ozone National Ambient Air Quality Standard (NAAQS).

As you are aware, on October 1, 2015, the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) decreased the level of the NAAQS for ozone from 75 parts per billion to 70 parts per billion. Within one year of promulgation of a new or revised NAAQS, section 107(d)(1)(A) of the Clean Air Act requires the governor of each state to submit to the EPA a list of all areas in the state, recommending designations with respect to the new or revised standard.

A review of Iowa's 2013-2015 ozone monitoring data in the enclosed document confirms that all of the ozone monitors in Iowa measured below 70 parts per billion. I therefore request that EPA designate all counties in Iowa as in attainment with respect to the new ozone NAAQS.
