SUBJECT: CRP-WHP (Wellhead Protection) Program Policy Change

It is to the benefit of Iowa's Community Water Supplies (CWS) and the citizens they serve, to enroll eligible land into the USDA-FSA CRP-WHP program. Historically, eligible acres were limited to the 2000 foot radius of the municipal wells. The Iowa DNR has established hydro-logically delineated public wellhead protection areas using a 10-year time-of-travel criteria. USDA-FSA has approved the 10 year time of travel for eligibility into the CRP-WHP program.

This recent change has the potential to increase the CRP-WHP program eligible acres in addition to decreasing Non-point Source risk to CWS.

Field staff assisting landowners/operators and CWS can access the Source Water Protection database to determine the 10 year time of travel capture zone areas. Directions are as follows:

- 1. Go to: http://www.iowadnr.gov/Environment/WaterQuality/SourcewaterProtection.aspx
- 2. Scroll down to "<u>Frequently Visited Websites</u>" and <u>click on the Source Water Tracker & Initial SWP Phase 1 Reports.</u>
- 3. The Iowa Source Water Protection Tracker will appear. At the top of the page <u>enter the name of the Municipal Water Supply</u> and <u>click on "SEARCH".</u> You do NOT need to enter the PWSID.
- 4. A new page will appear, on the left side it will indicate the name of the Municipal Water Supply. Click on the name of the Municipal Water Supply.
- 5. A new page will appear, scroll down to the most recent Phase 1 Assessment report and <u>click on the Phase 1 Report</u>
- 6. A new page will appear, scroll to the bottom pages. The map will indicate the 2, 5, and 10 year time of travel. Utilize the 10-year time of travel delineation for the CRP-WHP program eligibility. In Karst areas a one mile radius is utilized in place of a 10 year time of travel. In some situations, if no 10-year time of travel is available revert to the 2000' radius.
