### Nodaway

#### Discussion

The project engineer for the City of Nodaway requested two variances from this Department's design standards for sever systems to permit construction of a portion of the sever system at a less than minimum slope and to permit construction of some 6" diameter sever mains in lieu of the minimum 8" diameter sever required for public severs. Since the proposed flat sever will serve as an outfall line to one of the lagoon sites and will eliminate the need for a lift station with resultant savings in construction costs and operation and maintenance costs, the Executive Director granted a variance for this request on March 20, 1981. The request for a reduction in sever size was not granted since the 8" diameter has been used as the minimum size for public severs in Iowa for many years and is also generally accepted throughout the nation as the minimum acceptable sever size to minimize operational problems in the sanitary sever system.

#### Bauer Heights M.H.P.

#### Discussion

The project engineer for the Condo Park Development Corp. submitted an appeal of the construction permit issued for the proposed wastewater treatment facilities to serve the Bauer Heights Mobile Home Park to request that the effluent polishing pond as included in the approved plans and specifications be deleted from the project. The requirement for effluent polishing ponds following small activated sludge plants without duplicate units is a part of this Department's program guidance for Reliability for Activated Sludge Processes and is required to provide some degree of treatment when single treatment units must be taken out of service or in the event of an upset of the treatment process. In view of our Department policy for such treatment processes, the appeal for deletion of the effluent polishing pond was denied by the Executive Director on March 24, 1981.

Gentlemen:

We have reviewed the appeal filed by your project engineers on your behalf for deletion of the effluent polishing pond as included in the above-referenced construction permit issued by this Department on December 22, 1980.

Our program guidance for Reliability for Activated Sludge Processes requires that effluent polishing ponds be provided following any activated sludge treatment facility that is designed to receive less than an average of 100,000 gallons per day and 170 pounds BOD<sub>5</sub> per day and which does not have duplicate units. A copy of this program guidance is enclosed for your information in this regard. We recognize that the Ecolo-Chief wastewater treatment facility as proposed for this project does include four aeration tanks; however, only a single primary unit and a single final clarifier are provided. Therefore, in the event one of the clarifiers must be taken out of service or if sludge bulking should occur in the final clarifier, we feel that the effluent polishing pond would likely be necessary to maintain required effluent limitations during such emergency periods.

Based upon the above considerations, your appeal for deletion of the effluent polishing pond is hereby denied.
