Commission approval is requested for a service contract amendment with J.D. Weed, Inc., of Bedford, IA.

Amendment-3 Terms:

Amendment Amount: \$9,618.00

Amendment Dates: October 1, 2025 to September 30, 2027

Funding Source(s): General Fund

Amendment Purpose: The purpose is to extend the current contract for an additional two years to provide year-round collection, hauling, and disposal of garbage from Lake of Three Fires State Park. J.D. Weed, Inc., located in Bedford, Iowa, is the current service provider and has consistently responded to service requests and fulfilled them in a timely manner.

Original Contract Purpose: To provide year-round collection, hauling and disposal of garbage from 11 dumpster locations in 7 areas at Lake of Three Fires State Park. 2 of those areas are at campgrounds that generate a lot of trash. The other areas are popular beach, picnic and horse areas. During peak season, trash removal service is essential for general park users, renters of our day-use facilities, and campers. This service is vital for continuing to provide the quality and standards that park users have come to expect from Iowa State Parks while also allowing park staff to maintain their facilities and grounds.

Contract tasks include:

- May through September Service to empty 11 dumpsters at all 7 locations 2 times per week.
- October through April Service to empty 2 dumpsters at the shop and cabins 1 time per week.
- On-call services, providing extra pick-ups in case of an emergency.

Original Selection Process: The Department solicited proposals by publishing a Request for Quote (RFQ) through the Department of Administrative Services Bid Opportunities website and received one bid. J.D. Weed, Inc., was identified as the lowest responsive and responsible bidder and was awarded the contract.

Original Contract Terms: Amount \$9,018.00; Timeframe: 10/2021 to 9/2023; Purpose: Garbage collection and disposal.

Amendment-1 Terms: Amount: \$9,018.00; Timeframe: 10/2023 to 9/2025; Purpose: Extend contract two years.

Amendment-2 Terms: Amount: No change from Amendment 1; Timeframe: 10/2023 to 9/2025; Purpose: Modify invoicing procedures.

Amendment-3 Terms: Amount: \$9,618.00; Timeframe: 10/2025 to 9/2027; Purpose: Extend contract two years.

Commission approval is requested for a contract with Iowa Great Lakes Sanitary Sewer District, of Milford, IA.

Contract Terms

Amount: Not to exceed \$200,000

Dates: October 15, 2025 to October 31, 2026

Funding Source(s): Parks Infrastructure

Contract Purpose:

IGLSD manages the sanitary sewer district in the great lakes area of Iowa. The DNR has made plans to improve the sewer line system at Templar State Recreation Area (SRA) in Dickinson County. The North Templar Park homeowners association is advancing private sewer improvements such that its sewer flow will not be conveyed through DNR property. IGLSD plans to make sewer improvements to serve the South Templar Park homeowners association. Since both the IGLSD and the DNR are improving their sewer systems in the same area, the DNR is partnering with IGLSD to design and construct both projects together in order to save on cost and time. Once completed, the DNR sewer line will be fully compliant and sufficient in meeting its wastewater needs for Templar SRA.

Selection Process Summary: The Department is proposing to use an intergovernmental service contract (8A.122) with IGLSD to obtain the services needed for the project. State agencies are not required to use competitive selection when entering into such an agreement with another government entity (11 IAC 118.4). IGLSD followed their own competitive bidding process to acquire the necessary services for the project.

***9. Timber Sale Contract with Brad Anthony Logging, LLC for White Pine Hollow State Preserve**

Commission approval is requested for a timber sale contract with Brad Anthony Logging, LLC of Strawberry Point, IA, for White Pine Hollow State Preserve.

Contract Terms

Income: \$72,510.00

Dates: 11/01/25 to 03/31/2027

Fund Deposited to: Conservation Fund - Forestry

Contract Purpose: This contract will facilitate a hardwood timber harvest of an estimated 137,254 board feet in 879 mixed hardwood trees at White Pine Hollow State Preserve in Dubuque County. The harvest will remove shade tolerant species to increase sunlight for the regeneration of shade intolerant species. A natural areas inventory was conducted and there are no known threatened and endangered species in the harvest areas that will be impacted. Harvesting and regenerating these stands will help improve the overall health and vigor of the forest.



Wildlife den trees will be left standing. Iowa Forestry Best Management Practices will apply to the site. No tops or harvesting residue will be left in adjacent waterways. Harvesting is to occur only when ground is firm or frozen to minimize soil disturbance. Skid trails and landing areas will be repaired following the harvest. No skid trails will be allowed in the Stream Management Areas (within 50 feet of an adjacent waterway) except at designated stream crossings.

Selection Process Summary: An informal bid process was completed. To be qualified, a timber buyer must have on file with the State of Iowa a bond meeting the requirements of Section 456A.36 of the Code of Iowa and Chapter 571-72 of the Iowa Administrative Code. The area forester and supervisor reviewed the bid proposals and the highest bid from the most responsive and responsible bidder was selected.

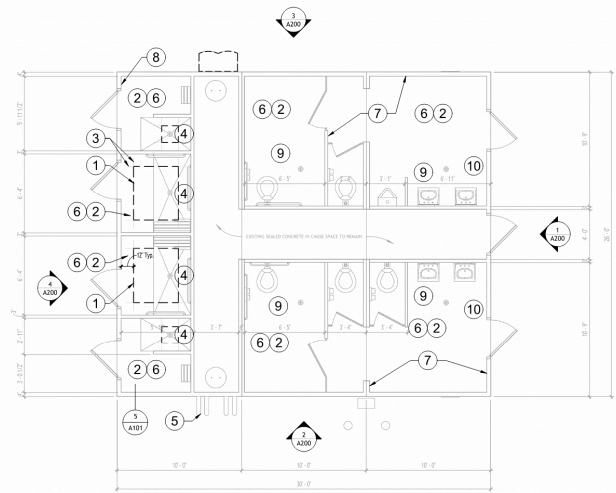


11.2 Clear Lake State Park, Restroom and Shower Building – Cerro Gordo County

***12.1 Chapter 17 Lease — Koch Fertilizer Wever LLC – Lee County**

The Natural Resource Commission is requested to approve a Chapter 17 Lease (Lease for use of State Owned Land) Number 138-N with Koch Fertilizer Wever, LLC.

Location: The lease covers a portion of the bed of the Mississippi River containing an area with 575 feet of frontage and of 38.75 feet of depth located at Mississippi River Mile 389.6 in Section 34, Township 68 North, Range 3 West of the 5th P.M., Lee County, Iowa,

Site Purpose: The site will be used for the loading and unloading of commercial fertilizer transportation.

Lease History: This is a new application for a Chapter 17 lease.

Lease Fee and Term: The annual fee of the lease is \$1,421.40. The term of the lease will be five years.

***12.2 Chapter 17 Lease - Zen-Noh American Holdings Corporation – Des Moines County**

The Natural Resource Commission is requested to approve a Chapter 17 Lease (Lease for use of State Owned Land) Number 140-N with Zen-Noh American Holdings Corporation.

Location: The lease covers a portion of the bed of the Mississippi River containing an area of 925 feet of frontage and 75 feet of depth at Mississippi River Mile 418.3 in Section 10, Township 71 N, Range 1 W of the 5th P.M., Des Moines County, Iowa.

Site Purpose: The site will be used for the loading and unloading of grain and soybeans.

***12.4 Buffalo Shores Access– Management Agreement - Scott CCB**

The Natural Resource Commission is requested to authorize the Director to approve the renewal of a 25-year management agreement with the Scott County Conservation Board. The area consists of approximately 25 acres and is locally known as Buffalo Shores Access located in Sec. 20 and 21, Township 77 N, Range 2 East of the 5th P.M., on the west bank of the Mississippi River, one-half mile downstream from the town of Buffalo, Iowa.

Sixteen and one-half acres of this tract was purchased with Marine Fuel Tax Funds and the remaining 8 ½ acres is federally-owned ground under license to the Department of Natural Resources.

Site Purpose: This 25-acre parcel is managed by Scott CCB as a campground and fishing access, including a boat ramp.

Management History: This property has been under a management agreement with the Scott County Conservation Board since 1974.

Management Agreement Term: This standard Management Agreement is with the Scott County Conservation Board for 25 years.

13. Contract with Iowa State University (ISU) to study oxygen and temperature dynamics in reservoirs and make management recommendations for future restoration projects

Commission approval is requested for a contract with Iowa State University (Principal Investigator: Thomas Detmer), Ames, IA.

Contract Terms:

Amount: Not to exceed \$561,151.00

Dates: November 1, 2025 – June 30, 2029

DNR shall have the option to extend this Contract for up to six years from the beginning date of the original contract by executing a signed amendment prior to the expiration of this Contract.

Funding Source(s): Lake Restoration Program (\$420,863); DNR Fisheries (\$140,288)

Background: Iowa reservoirs are facing compounding challenges from nutrient pollution, climate changes, and reservoir aging, making it more difficult to assess both the causes of poor water quality and develop restoration strategies to overcome these challenges. While Iowa is a leader for water quality monitoring in our lakes and reservoirs, we still have a very limited understanding of how different arms of our reservoirs function, since most data are collected from a single sampling point on each waterbody. Thus, we tend to oversimplify important water quality parameters that likely vary considerably across a reservoir – temperature and oxygen concentrations. Most of the public lakes in Iowa are man-made reservoirs.

Temperature and oxygen gradients, coupled with phosphorus-rich sediments drive internal loading in our reservoirs. DNR has invested heavily in both understanding the mechanisms for internal loading in our lakes and reservoirs, as well as managing internal loading in several lakes through alum applications to inactivate phosphorus being released from the sediments. However; we still have a very limited understanding of how oxygen and thermal stratification varies across our dendritic reservoirs. These oxythermal dynamics influence everything from algae blooms to where fish can find suitable across our reservoirs.

This study will use a combination of computer 1-Dimensional modeling to characterize temperature and oxygen dynamics for approximately 100 reservoirs in Iowa using a combination of existing data and additional data collected as a part of this study. This approach will leverage 25 years of monitoring data already collected by DNR and provide a unique tool for predicting reservoir responses to different restoration activities.

Additionally, we will utilize radio-tagged fish as biological indicators of where sufficient oxythermal conditions exist in our reservoirs, providing insight for stocking, maximization of suitable habitat and informing future restoration efforts to enhance fisheries and overall ecosystem health.

Products delivered to DNR from this multiyear study will be a report summarizing results and management recommendations, both for lake restoration projects and fishery enhancements. Additionally, ISU will present results annually through periodic presentations and summary reports. Finally, ISU will create a public facing presentation (likely a YouTube video) summarizing results for a general audience.

Contract Purpose: The purpose of this agreement is to work with Iowa State University to better understand spatial and temporal oxygen and temperature dynamics in Iowa reservoirs and how they impact both water quality and fish. Products from this multi-year research effort will include a final report of findings and management recommendations, both for fishery enhancements and dredging/lake bathymetry recommendations to minimize internal phosphorus recycling and improve water quality.
