

*Examples of Recent REAP Private Cost-share Grants Awarded (not a full list)*

**2010**

1. **Iowa Natural Heritage Foundation** – Waterman Prairie Complex Addition, Tuttle Property. Acquisition of 142 acres to the Waterman Prairie Complex expanding the complex to 1,602 acres. This addition includes remnant prairie which is home to 11 conservation plants species and five Species of Greatest Conservation Need. Located 15 miles northwest of the town of Cherokee on 430<sup>th</sup> St., Cherokee County.  
GRANT AMOUNT – \$221,250.
2. **Iowa Natural Heritage Foundation** – Chytka Addition to Stone State Park Addition. Acquisition of 70 acres to Stone State Park expanding the park to 1,484 acres. Stone State Park continues to be the largest publicly protected recreational area in Woodbury County. This addition will protect more Loess Hills, increase recreational opportunities for the over 200,000 annual visitors and enhance the habitat for the seven Species of Greatest Conservation Need inventoried on the property. It is located at the southeast corner of Stone State Park, Sioux City.  
GRANT AMOUNT – \$179,000.

**2008**

1. **Iowa Natural Heritage Foundation**- Stone State Park acquisition, Lieber Property. Acquisition of 24 acres to Stone State Park, located south of the Sloan Acquisition, east of Sioux River Road, Sioux City.  
GRANT AMOUNT -- \$50,250
2. **Iowa Natural Heritage Foundation**- Upper Iowa River Wildlife Addition, Gaul Property. Acquisition of 48.3 acres as an addition to the Upper Iowa River Wildlife Area, located east of Kendallville, along County Road W14, north of Coldwater Creek Road, Winneshiek County.  
GRANT AMOUNT -- \$182,500
3. **Iowa Natural Heritage Foundation**- Loess Hills Wildlife Management Area Addition. Acquisition of 136 acres of land as an addition to the Loess Hills, located along the southern end of the state property, three miles west of Castana and 2.5 miles north of Turin, Monona County.  
GRANT AMOUNT -- \$240,000

**2007**

1. **Upper Iowa River Greenbelt**- Soenksen property. Acquisition of 26.9 acres in Winneshiek County, 3.5 miles east of Kendallville. Includes more than ½ mile of river frontage surrounded on three sides by DNR and county conservation board property. Completes protection on the entire Chimney Rock loop of the Upper Iowa River.  
GRANT AMOUNT -- \$95,500
2. **Kuehn Conservation Area of the Raccoon River Greenbelt**– Kuehn Family and Stewart additions. Acquisition of 122 acres bringing the conservation area to a total of 732 acres, about 35 miles west of Des Moines.  
GRANT AMOUNT -- \$255,560

**2006**

1. **Iowa Natural Heritage Foundation**- Stone State Park Addition. Two parcels, in city limits of Sioux City. Prairie pasture and oak woodland. Important protection/buffer for Stone State Park.  
GRANT AMOUNT -- \$205,600
2. **Nature Conservancy and O'Brien County Sportsmen's Club**- Waterman Prairie Addition. An important in-holding for adjacent state lands in the Waterman Prairie Complex. 27 acres cropped. Remainder pasture with extensive prairie remnants and small bur oak grove. Management by IDNR.  
GRANT AMOUNT -- \$154,042.50

3. **Guthrie CCB, Audubon County PF, North Polk PF, Prairie Woodland Conservation Foundation-** Bennie Hall WMA Acquisition. Along WMA of Middle Raccoon River. Results in a 512-acre complex. This parcel is 172 acres of woodland, 22 acres of crop fields, and 1-acre building on site.  
GRANT AMOUNT -- \$56,250
